GRATITUDE

"Hughes UMC saved my family."

Written above are the words of Maria Josefina. a mother of two from Salvador. She and her kids were facing eviction from their apartment. She lost her job for almost eight months as the kitchen assistant in a small local restaurant. She came to our church asking for help. Thanks to the donations made to the Pastor's Discretionary Fund, we were able to offer rent assistance. We also supported her with clothes and past-due utility bills.

Maria also exclaimed, "Thank you to the people of Hughes UMC for their caring hearts and loving support to my family during this pandemic. Thanks to you, my kids and I didn't become homeless."

This is just one example among many on how much we have been serving our community. Your gifts have gone outside the walls to provide for many. Thank you for your generosity.

After almost eighteen months, we are starting to see the light at the end of the tunnel. Our church has been serving as a COVID-19 testing site as well as a vaccination site. We will continue serving as the Mid-County hub for the duration. The Montgomery County granted us a 2021-2022 grant of \$300,000 to expand our services to the community. These funds will be used to provide salaries for the hub staff, which includes hiring a new Grant Writer/Community Outreach person. In addition to this grant, we will be receiving a weekly grant of \$13,000 for food. Montgomery County has contracted with food companies where we order weekly staples, and the county pays them directly. Our church was also granted \$60,000 to help us to cover the gym use as well as utilities.

Our church is now open for in-person worship. Even though the CDC and the Montgomery County have new rules about social distancing and the use of masks, we will continue using the same safety protocols. We will request social distancing and people need to register every Sunday and sanitize their hands as they enter the sanctuary. Wearing a mask is mandatory and we request that all people be fully vaccinated. Our custodians will sanitize after each service. Members' and visitors' safety are our main priority.

On July 10-16 and 17-23, we will be receiving two groups of 30 teens from "The Praying Pelicans Mission." The first group will do Vacation Bible School for a week and the second group will do church painting and repairs. In addition to this summer program, we will buy some picnic tables from the county funds for an outdoor space to offer lunch and Bible studies to seniors. Look for an update on this project in July. In August we will do baptism and new members classes. In September, we will host the International Fiesta and in October we will also celebrate a Family Fall Festival and December a Posada. Through our Friday special E-news we will keep you posted about these events.

As we continue praising God with our gifts and service to the community, I invite us all to keep praying for our church and it's plans, programs and events. Thank you for your prayers.

Covid Vaccine was a success! We vaccinated 325 people for the first dose and 320 received the second dose.











Thank you for this gift that I will use to continue my undergrad in Elementary Education at Towson University.


Vacation Bible School (VBS) is Coming Soon!
